When Clover's treatment was complete and she was finally ready to be placed in a foster home, she was suffering from muscle atrophy and would lose control of her hind legs. You couldn't help but feel sorry for such a sweet girl, who had been dealt such an unfortunate lot. But with regular, gentle exercise, good nutrition and lots of love and attention, Clover began to blossom. She proved to be good with other dogs and simply adored children -- any family would be lucky to have her, but MARF wanted to be sure it would be the perfect home for Clover, who had waited so long to be loved by her own family.



Five months after being picked up off the street, Clover found her forever home with a family of Golden Retrievers and two dotting owners. Today, she swims at the beach, goes on boat rides, and frolics through the fields on her family's farm. You would never be able to tell she once couldn't run without her legs collapsing beneath her. She is no longer cast outside, unwanted; instead Clover is sleeping in warm bed with her whole pack -- her owners and doggie brothers.
